Sprankle was operating the vehicle. Guerin was in the front passenger seat and attempted to provide a false name. Officers observed Guerin attempt to remove and item from her jacket and conceal it behind her. Guerin was removed from the vehicle and a placed into custody. A search was conducted on the vehicle as Guerin had attempted to conceal narcotics. Sprankle and Guerin were both arrested for possession and paraphernalia. A male in the backseat was arrested for syringes as well. Both Guerin and Sprankle stated they were at Weaklands earlier this date and he was in possession of a large amount of meth. Both were unsure if he had a gun.

Officers then executed the search warrant on room 115 and seized a small amount of drugs and paraphernalia.

Contact was made with Roland in room 114 and he denied Hewitt was there. Roland was advised officers were going to get a search warrant for the room and he called for Hewitt to come out. Hewitt was arrested for the task force warrants and a BCSD warrant. Roland was arrested for hindering apprehension and a BCSD warrant. A search warrant was compiled for room 114 and paraphernalia was seized.

Allegheny Twp police then conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle operated by Lena Chura, where Weakland was a passenger in the vehicle. Weakland was arrested for possession of meth, heroin and Xanax as a result of the stop. Weakland also had a BCSD warrant and was transported to APD.

Officers learned Chura had rented a room, 243 at Motel 6 with Weakland and they were there prior to the traffic stop. Contact was made at the room with a female, Bri Allen, and items were observed in plain view to obtain a search warrant for the room.

The search warrant was executed and a small amount of drugs were located. Allen was also arrested for false id and a warrant from Cambria County.

Officers then obtained a search warrant for Weaklands residence. White powder was observed on the kitchen/dining room table and a K-9 alerted on a safe in the residence. The safe was empty and it appeared Weakland had removed the drugs when he left the residence that night.

Officers then returned to APD and packaged evidence and transported prisoners to BCP.

Officers had also gone to Sprankle's residence for a welfare check on her teenage children. CYS was called and the kids were released to their father. The gun Kunkle referred to that Sprankle had was determined to be a pellet gun.

Charges for this incident will be filed both by APD, Logan Twp PD and Allegheny Twp PD.

Detailed Investigative Goals and Scope of Drug Activity (attach additional sheets of paper as needed for narrative: On 8-28-19 officers of the Altoona Police Department conducted an interdiction detail on the 500 blk of 10th St, specifically watching the residence of Robert Patterson, who resided at 510 10th St. Officers received information that Patterson was involved in a drug delivery resulting in death during the weekend. Surveillance officers viewed Patterson's wife leave the residence and drive approximately a half block where she stopped and picked up Patterson and another male. Officers were able to gain probable cause for a traffic stop on the vehicle. As a result of the traffic stop Patterson was arrested and officers seized approximately (5) bricks of heroin, (5) grams of bulk heroin and a ½ oz of methamphetamine. Patterson was transported to APD where he immediately agreed to cooperate.

Officers then conducted buy busts on Patterson's sources. Officers first arrested Jamie Lansberry on the 400 blk of N 2nd St after she delivered meth to Patterson. Lansberry was currently on bail for previous drug deliveries. Lansberry was arrested and later transported to BCP. Bail revocation will be filed by the Blair County DA's Office.

Officers next arrested Timothy Thomas after delivering a bundle of heroin to the CI at Dollar General 1230 14th Ave. Thomas was arrest and later transported to BCP.

Officers next arrested Michael Fletcher after delivering heroin to the CI. Fletcher fled on foot and was apprehended after a brief pursuit through several yards. Fletcher also had an outstanding warrant from APD for Aggravated Assault. Fletcher was later transported to BCP.

Officers next arrested Michael Burchfield and Summer Heil at the Super 8 motel after the CI purchased an 8-ball of meth. Officers obtained a search warrant for Burchfield and Heil's motel room after their arrest. Officers seized (5) firearms from the room, including (1) which was reported stolen. Officers also seized approximately (1 ½) bricks of heroin and a half oz of meth from the room. During an interview Burchfield admitted he would trade drugs to obtain the guns. Burchfield and Heil was later transported to BCP.

The investigation is currently ongoing with the CI and it is anticipated he will be able to provide officers with more information to arrest other drug dealers.

So far this year we have made 9 controlled buys. Since June we have incident numbers 2019-00470; 01641; 1690; 2015; 2824; 2926; 2913; 2969; 2985 that were all on our targets that were gained through surveillance of known drug houses in our community. Additional funding will allow us to grow our pool of Cl's, make additional buys, and the continued surveillance that we need to reach our goal.

APD Detectives were called to assist and as a result of the investigation officers were going to obtain (2) search warrants for the residence of Nicole Keller (E Maple Ct) and Robert Patterson (10th St), who had provided the heroin to Bryant. Patterson left APD prior to officers obtaining the search warrants and returned to his residence. It is believed Patterson flushed heroin in the toilet prior to officers making contact with him. Search warrants were obtained for both locations. Officers seized (10) packets of heroin from Keller's residence, along with a marijuana pipe, grinder and \$200.00. Officers seized a large amount of paraphernalia from Patterson's residence and a packet of heroin stamped "OD" which is the same stamp that was recovered from Keller's residence.

Both Keller and Patterson were charged with Drug Delivery resulting in death as well as related drug delivery charges.

While on scene front desk personnel advised officers of high flow traffic from rooms 302, rented by Jenna Raia and 303 rented by Roxie Dick. Officers made contact at the rooms and were granted consent by Raia to search the room. Officers observed items in plain view to obtain a search warrant for the room. Raia and Robert McCloskey were taken into custody and transported to APD.

In room 303 officers encountered Roxie Dick, Michael Beck and Ryan Hines. Officers learned that Himes was there to purchase meth from Dick. Beck and Himes were transported to APD for items they had on their person during a pat down search. Additional manpower was then called in to compile and execute the search warrants for both rooms.

Raia and McCloskey were arrested for Conspiracy and PWID/Delivery of Meth. Officers located a small amount of meth in the rom with owe sheets, digital scales and communication on the phones arranging drug deals. Dick was arrested for PWID meth after officers located over an 8-ball of meth in her purse. Beck and Himes were arrested for misdemeanor drug offenses and released.

While on scene, Allen Shannon arrived to room 302. Shannon was arrested for possession of the meth and searched incident to arrest. Shannon had a 9mm handgun in his bag (later reported stolen by the owner) which he was prohibited from possessing. Shannon also had paraphernalia and assorted pills on his person and in his bag.

Detailed Investigative Goals and Scope of Drug Activity (attach additional sheets of paper as needed for narrative: On 12-27-19 members of the Altoona Police Department were at 512 12th St apt 2 for a patrol call when officers encountered a male, Jeremiah Phillips, in a room with several thousand new unused packets commonly used to package heroin. Officers obtained a search warrant and seized a large amount of drug packaging material and approximately 1.5 ounces of raw unpackaged heroin in a false bottom container. As a result of the search warrant Phillips and Tori Wilt were both arrested and charged. While officers were inside the apartment, a neighbor informed officers that a male named Jonathan Delacruz had showed up outside with multiple bundles of heroin in his hand. When Delacruz saw police, he asked the neighbor if police were at his apartment and he then fled. Delacruz is a known high-level distributor of heroin, who recently moved to Altoona from Cambria County. Wilt also identified Delacruz as the source for the heroin seized in the residence. Beginning on 12-27-19 and through 12-29-19 officers then conducted surveillance on Delacruz's residence 2815 6th Ave in an attempt to obtain a search warrant for his residence. Officers observed minimal activity at the residence. Officers also checked local hotels for Delacruz's vehicle, a black Audi with negative results. Agent Quist later observed a vehicle believed to be owned by Delacruz's relative at the rear of the residence but officers did not observe Delacruz. After minimal activity the detail was suspended. Officers will be able to arrest Delacruz for the heroin seized from the 12th St residence, however the investigation is still ongoing in an attempt to gain a search warrant to additional stash house locations.
