Kunkle reported he had just returned from Pittsburgh, where he purchased (9) bricks of heroin. Kunkle stated he kept (2) bricks of heroin and (7) bricks were given to Craig Hatfield. Kunkle stated Hatfield came to his residence and took the heroin he had from him. Officers were able determine Hatfield's residence was 1204 14th Ave Apt 4. Officers conducted surveillance and observed a white female arrive and depart in a short amount of time. Officers conducted a traffic stop on that vehicle and recovered (50) packets of heroin. The female stated she purchased the heroin from Hatfield. Officers then obtained a search warrant for the residence. While waiting for the search warrant officers observed a black male arrive and depart in a short amount of time. Officers recovered approximately 1 pound of marijuana from the males vehicle. Another black male was observed making a short stop at the residence. Upon stopping that males vehicle officers recovered additional heroin.</p> <p>Officers then executed the search warrant at the residence. Both Craig Hatfield and Shahina Miller fled the residence as officers were executing the search warrant. Miller was arrested in a first floor apartment. Hatfield was arrested in the basement. Officers searched the residence. Among other items, officers seized a sawed-off shotgun, over 550 packets of heroin and a approximately \$7500.00.</p> <p>Miller and Hatfield were both transported to Blair County Central Booking for processing and arraignment.</p>





Officers made contact at the room and found Vesey had departed prior to police arrival. Officers contacted Carroll and probable cause was developed for a search warrant on the room. A search warrant was obtained and Carroll will be arrested at a later date for drug offenses, pending cooperation.</p> <p>Thomas and Lochman were transported to BCP. A warrant is still outstanding for Batts. Charges to be filed on Carroll at a later date.</p>

Patrol Officers made contact with both parties and Campbell was attempting to leave as officers were trying to speak with him. An officer was standing on Campbell's porch when Campbell swiftly closed the door, causing a strong odor of raw, unburnt marijuana to be pushed in the officers face from the door. Campbell then got in his vehicle and departed. Officers contacted Sgt Moser who advised he would contact DA Weeks for search warrant authorization. Additional Logan Twp Officers were also called in to assist. While LTPD was compiling the search warrant, Campbell returned to the area of his residence and upon seeing officers attempted to flee.
