





Officers eventually made contact at the residence with ██████████ and a 3-year-old child. Officers observed paraphernalia in view and were going to clear the rest of the residence to secure a search warrant. ██████████ was located in a bedroom with additional paraphernalia and methamphetamine. Dickson also had an active state parole warrant. Samantha Lucas was also located, hiding in a closet on the 3rd Floor. Lucas also had an active state parole warrant. The adults were transported to APD. Officers obtained food for the child and she was released to her father via CYF.</p> <p>A search warrant was obtained and officers located approx. 1.5 ounces of meth, 4 grams of fentanyl, 25 grams of marijuana, paraphernalia, pills and suboxone strips, a sawed-off shotgun and a handgun.</p> <p>Dickson, Pletcher and Lucas were all transported to Central Booking. A warrant will be obtained for ██████████, who also lives at the residence but was not present during the search warrant.</p>



Due to the high risk of the entry into Jenkin's residence, the Altoona Police Department's Tactical Response Team planned the execution of the search warrant.</p>			
<p>On March 23rd, 2022 Officers executed the search warrant at Tyan Jenkins' residence just after 6am. Jenkins was not present at the residence. Officers located a holster for a pistol, a cell phone, and a gun cleaning kit from Jenkins' residence.</p>			
<p>Detective Hand was able to obtain an arrest warrant for aggravated assault and firearms violation as a result of the investigation.</p>





<p>On Wednesday, June 22, 2022 Cpl Nixon (Altoona PD) and Ptlm Brandt (Allegheny Twp PD) responded to [REDACTED] E, Altoona, PA for a narcotics investigation. PA State Parole agents had conducted a home check with [REDACTED] at this apartment and observed drug paraphernalia in plain view. Parole agents detained and searched [REDACTED] person and located suspected fentanyl in his pocket. Cpl Nixon and Ptlm Brandt obtained a search warrant for this apartment and executed same this date. Approximately 26.5 grams of suspected fentanyl was seized along with a large quantity of packaging material and paraphernalia. Also located were blender bottles with suspected fentanyl residue throughout as well as sifting devices.</p> <p>[REDACTED] was interviewed by Officers and reported that the powdery substance contained fentanyl and a horse tranquilizer he heard was Xylazine. [REDACTED] provided limited information about his Philadelphia source of these narcotics but was confident his source could deliver additional narcotics to him within hours of being contacted. [REDACTED] described the fentanyl/xylazine substance to be very potent and required those who used it to frequently inject more to maintain a high. [REDACTED] alleged to know of approximately 5 other individuals in the Altoona area who were receiving this substance to distribute.</p> <p>A parole detainer was issued for [REDACTED] and he was charged with Possession with intent to deliver, possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of a small amount of marijuana.</p>







<p>On Friday, September 2, 2022, Officer and Agents from the above listed agencies conducted a saturation detail in the City of Altoona. Officers successfully located and took into custody Kimberly Meyers who had a felony warrant for firearm and narcotics related charges. Meyers' coconspirator, Clifford Baxter, was unable to be located. Officers further attempted to serve warrants for John Setser, Bridget Bark, and others wanted by the Altoona Police Dept and Blair County Sheriff's Office.</p> <p>Officers conducted twenty field contacts and thirty-two vehicle stops. Three pursuits were initiated. The first vehicle pursuit ended after the operator evaded apprehension on foot. The operator is believed to be Ray Hemingway who is currently listed as a State Parole absconder. The second vehicle pursuit was terminated due to safety concerns and the operator is unknown. The third (foot) pursuit ended by apprehension and additional charges were filed related to a domestic violence incident. Four warrants were served during this detail.
